

## A New Marketing Approach for The United States Power Squadrons®

You may have heard that the United States Power Squadrons is changing its name to America's Boating Club. We are still the United States Power Squadrons. However, we ARE changing the way we promote our organization to the boating public, including a more dynamic image, more relevant words to describe ourselves, and modernized graphics. And that includes using America's Boating Club® as a marketing moniker and descriptor.

At the national Board of Governors meeting in Dallas, and from comments and suggestions from across USPS members over the last year or so, most of us agree that we need to update our image in the boating market place. Our name, the United States Power Squadrons, does not resonate with the public. What does a "squadron" mean? What does "power" mean? Nowhere does it imply that we are a boating organization. Furthermore, most of the recreational boating public is not familiar with our name at all, or they get us mixed up with other organizations. So, we need to update our image to appeal to today's boaters. It must identify who we are, and why someone should be interested. The logo that was developed to represent our new image is:



The logo incorporates our new moniker, our traditional ship's wheel logo, and graphic representations of paddling, power boating, and sailing all merged into one fluid representation of our organization.

The national organization is transitioning to the new identity, and so are squadrons and districts. The rollout timeline is still being finalized, but is currently estimated at 6-12 months. As the promotion evolves you will begin to see this logo more and more.

# January Members' Meeting Will Feature "A Discussion on Search and Rescue"

The January 23<sup>rd</sup> Members' Meeting will feature a discussion on Search and Rescue by USCG Commander J. Andrew Ely. The Commander will discuss the Coast Guard's search and rescue organization and the methodologies they use to respond to reports of actual or potential distress. He will cover Search and Rescue statistics for the Long Island Sound region, partnerships they leverage to maximize response, recent updates to technology and systems they use, the importance of media (including social media) in solving search and rescue cases, statistics, the most at-risk boating populations, and actions taken to effect change in at-risk groups. The Commander is also willing to discuss anything else that is of interest to our group.

Since graduating from the Coast Guard Training Center, Cape May, NJ, in 1993, Commander Ely has amassed an impressive set of credentials. His honors include the Captain David H. Jarvis Award for Inspirational Leadership, the National Graduate School Distinguished Academic Student Award, the



Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medal, four Coast Guard Commendation Medals, the Coast Guard Achievement Medal, and four Commandant's Letter of Commendation Ribbons. He currently serves as the Response Department Head at Coast Guard Sector Long Island Sound in New Haven, CT where he is responsible for oversight of maritime search and rescue, maritime law enforcement, and incident management. Please plan to join us for an evening that is sure to interesting and informative.
