September Member Meeting Featured "The Connecticut River from Sail to Steam".



The September Member and Guest Meeting featured a talk by Brenda Milkofsky, curator emerita and currently a member of the Board of Trustees of the Connecticut River Museum in Essex. The talk described the early sailing history of the Connecticut River beginning with Adriaen Block in 1614 and early ship building activity on the river during the age of sail. The burning of Essex in 1814 by the British ended the age of sailing ship construction in Essex but Essex rebounded as a major port as transportation evolved to steam power. The museum is actually on the site of a major steamboat warehouse that serviced trade from New York and Boston to Essex and up the river to Middletown and Hartford from the 1850s to the 1930s.

Fall Education Schedule

We have a great line up of courses for this fall. If you are interested in one of these classes, please call or e-mail to talk about it and/or sign up. There is still time!

Seamanship (S) begins 8 October at 1900 at the Farmington St. James Episcopal Church (\$60, \$145 non member)

This course provides more detail on many of the subjects covered in our basic "ABC3" course including: rules of the road, navigation aids, using your VHF radio, boat handling under adverse conditions, anchoring, additional knots, and additional first aid and safety. If you have just finished "ABC3" please try to take this course. Those new members that took Piloting last spring are also encouraged to take this course. If you signed up as a new member last spring, you can take this course as a "member".

Advanced Piloting (AP) begins 19 October at the MDC in Hartford (\$55 member)

You must have passed the Piloting (P) course as a prerequisite. The course continues to build coastal and inland navigation skills, advanced positioning techniques (such as advancing a line of position, other electronics: radar, depth sounders, autopilots, chart plotters, laptop computer software, etc.), hazard avoidance techniques using electronics (e.g., "keep out" zones in GPS), collision avoidance using radar and GPS, working with tides (clearances, depth), effects of current, and piloting with wind and currents. If you are a sailor or operator of a slower vessel the "set and drift" calculations will allow you to maintain a course when beset with strong currents or wind.

Weather (W) begins 14 October at the Instructor's home in Bloomfield (\$60 member/\$135 New Member)

The course focuses on how weather systems form, behave, move, and interact with one another and reflects the availability of all sorts of weather reports and forecasts on the Internet. The student will learn how to use pressure measurements and cloud formations to predict future weather, how to estimate wind speeds using the Beaufort scale and take precautions for emergency situations such as the gale force winds accompanying thunderheads and the excessive wind speeds of hurricanes. Every mariner contemplating longer cruises should take this course.



Hartford Power Squadron Spends a Day at Chester Point Marina

On August 15th, Hartford Power Squadron members conducted an entire day of Vessel Safety Examinations at Chester Point Marina on the Connecticut River.

In addition to the safety examinations, instruction was given in the proper use, handling and disposal of visual distress signals (V.D.S.). Special attention was given to pyrotechnic devices. The following devices were demonstrated:

- Red Hand-held Flare (day and night)
- Parachute Flare (day and night)
- Red Meteor (day and night)
- Orange Hand-held Smoke Signal (day only)

Additionally the proper use and handling of the ubiquitous B-1 dry chemical fire extinguisher was demonstrated. Those wishing to participate were able to experience their hands on use.

Annual Report of the Treasurer

During the past fiscal year the Treasurer's Department performed the following duties:

- Received, deposited and accounted for all cash receipts for membership dues, educational courses, the ship's store and membership functions.
- Paid and accounted for all bills, invoices and reimbursement requests.
- Prepared and filed required financial information with USPS National Office.
- File State and Federal tax required documents and payments.
- Prepared and presented monthly reports for Executive Committee meetings.
- Prepared and presented a budget for the fiscal year ending February 28, 2014 for approval by the Executive Committee and the general membership.
- Managed the investments accounts of the HPS according to HPS bylaws.
- Cooperated with the Internal Auditor in his annual review.

Although we would have preferred to have a net zero budget, this goal proved unrealistic as interest earned on the squadron's \$35,000 maintained in CDs have been nearly cut in half every year since 2009 falling from \$1,700 to \$139. Record low rates of 0.40% have been broken. It was hoped that the rate would improve as the CDs continue to roll but the opposite has occurred as they have begun to roll at a new low of 0.20%. While the CD situation is mostly out of our hands and will eventually recover, a more alarming trend lurks in the shadow, significant drop in dues income. Down 25% from last year at this time. While we began to address this issue by raising our dues by \$2/year we will need to address waning membership over the next 2 years through greater membership solicitation.

This being my last year as treasurer, I would like to thank you all for the privilege of serving you as treasurer for the past 2 years.


